



The Liturgy at Calvary

ADVENT III "Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the

ALL We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.






P It is indeed right and good that we should everywhere and always offer thanks and praise to you, Holy God mighty and immortal through Jesus Christ our Lord.



In-Person: We commune by continuous line by intinction.


Ushers will guide.




