


The Liturgy at Calvary

Forerunners and messengers advance the advent of our God. While John the baptizer's voice in the wilderness may be the principal focus of the day, Malachi's prophecy could as easily herald the coming Christ as forerunner of the LORD of hosts. Finally all

the baptized are called to participate in the sharing of the gospel. In so doing we prepare the way for the coming of Jesus and assist all people in capturing a vision of the "salvation of God."

First Reading Malachi 3:1-4



Second Reading Philippians 1:3-11





and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth;


⁶and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"



ALL We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.






P It is indeed right and good that we should everywhere and always offer thanks and praise to you, Holy God mighty and immortal through Jesus Christ our Lord.

You comforted your people with the promise of the Redeemer, through whom you will also make all things new, when He comes again to judge the world in righteousness.







Online at Home:


If you have elements at home, commune with those in attendance at the same time. We encourage you to communion each other and bless children who have not received First Communion.





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Commemorations This Week

Lucy, martyr, died 304 Friday, December 13, 2024

Lucy was a young Christian of Sicily who was martyred during the persecutions under Emperor Diocletian. Her celebration became particularly important in Sweden and Norway, perhaps because the feast of Lucia (whose name means "light") originally fell on the shortest day of the year.

John of the Cross, renewer of the church, died 1591 Saturday, December 14, 2024

John was a member of the Carmelite monastic order, and worked to reform it. His writings reflect a deep interest in mystical thought and meditation.
