

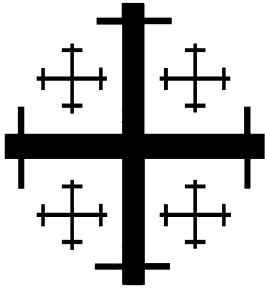

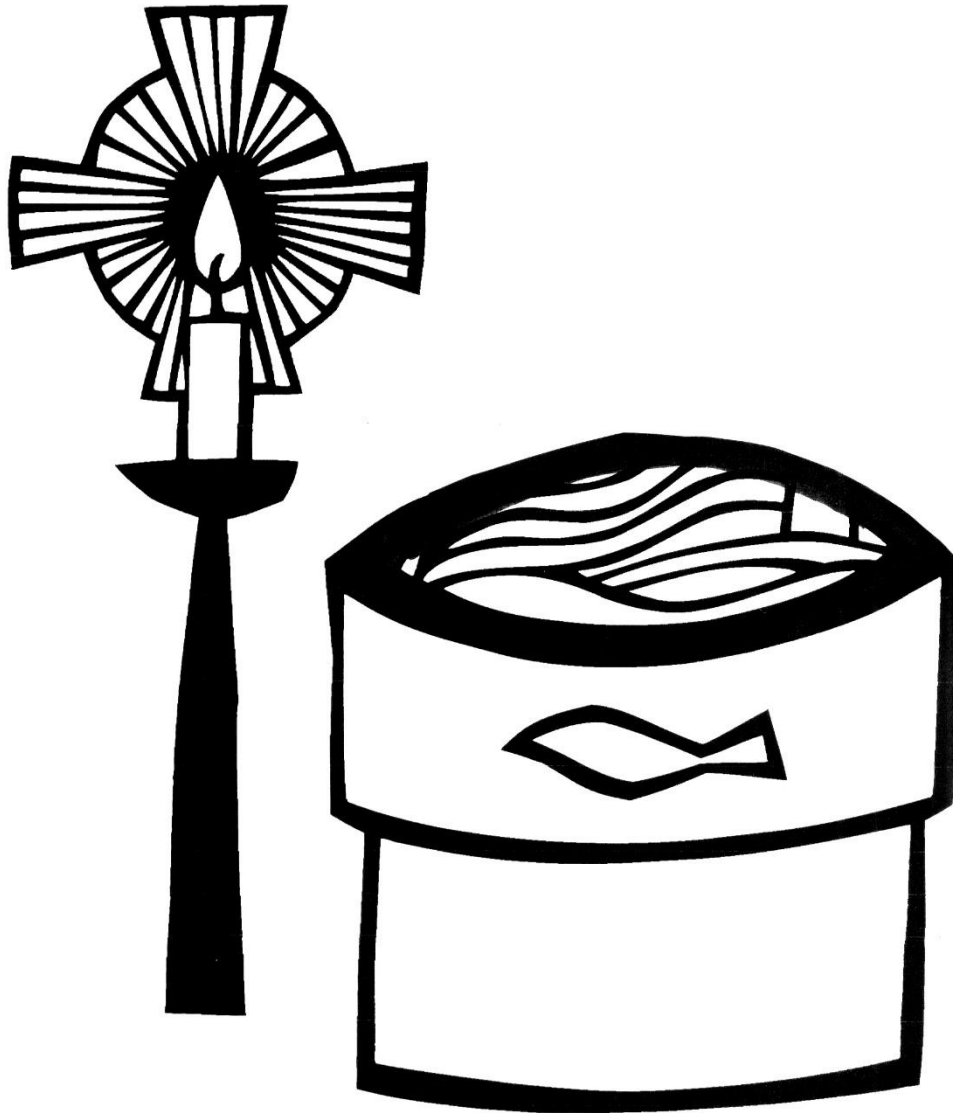

A Let us profess our faith in the Triune God.


ALL We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

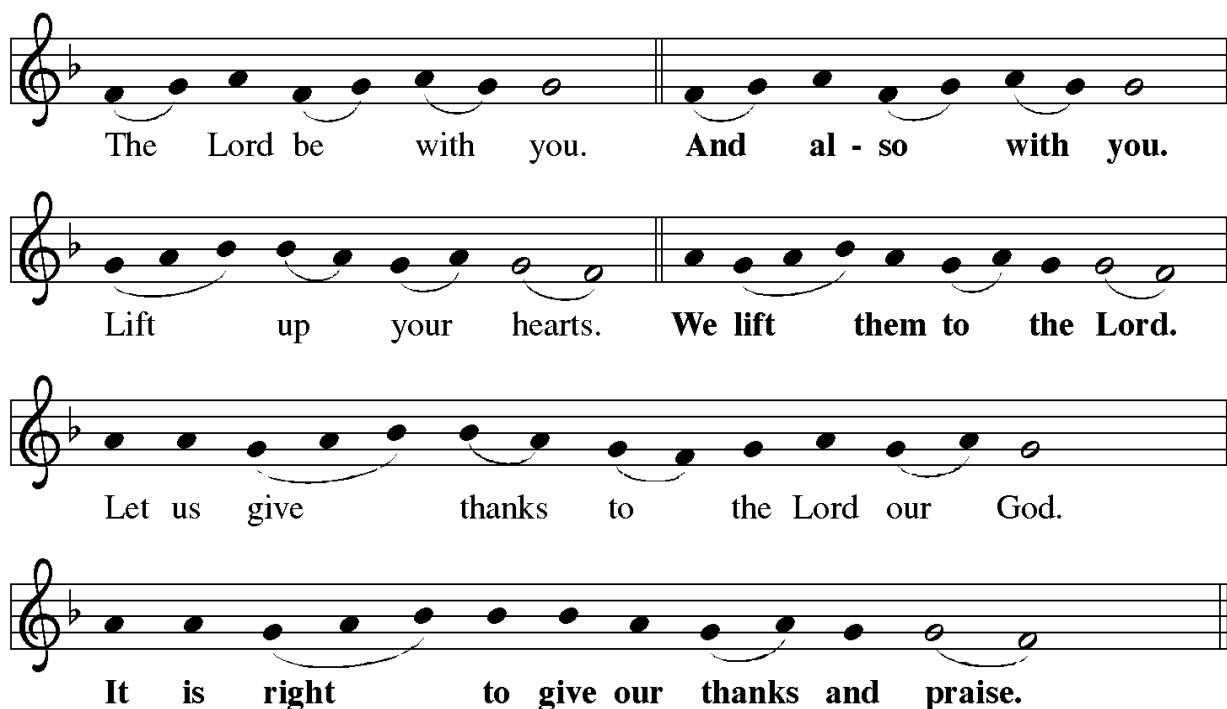




