UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Presentation of Our Lord

Monday, February 2, 2026

Forty days after the birth of Jesus we mark the day Mary and Joseph presented him in the temple in accordance with Jewish law. There they were greeted by Simeon, an aged priest who offered the song "Lord, now you let your servant depart in peace," as well as by the prophet Anna, who spoke of the redemption of Israel.

Ansgar, Bishop of Hamburg, missionary to Denmark and Sweden, died 865

Tuesday, February 3, 2026

A monk who helped bring Christianity to Scandinavia, Ansgar returned to Germany where he was named bishop of Hamburg. He is remembered for his love for poor people.

The Martyrs of Japan, died 1597

Thursday, February 5, 2026

Christianity was brought to Japan in the sixteenth century by Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries. The religion was suppressed, however, and in 1597 twenty-six missionaries and converts were crucified. Nevertheless, Christianity survived and later prospered.

Notes by Debbie on today's Prelude and Offertory

Prelude:

"Duo" was edited for organ but I am choosing to use Calvary's harpsichord for it this week!

This piece is part of a collection I discovered during a workshop at the Regional Guild of Organist's Convention in Fort Worth last summer. The "Women Composers' Album" is curated and edited by Charles Callahan and features 20 pieces, mostly unknown or rarely played. Some familiar artists are Clara Schumann and Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel but most are lesser-known musicians. You have heard a few of these pieces already - how wonderful it is to give a new life to them!

Elisabeth von Herzogenberg (Stockhausen) was born in Paris, France on April 13th, 1847, and died on January 7th, 1892. She was a German pianist, composer, singer and philanthropist. Her father was a Hanoverian ambassador and pianist linked to Frederic Chopin and Charles-Valentin Alkan. She studied and associated with Johannes Brahms although she largely did not perform or publish for the public.

Offertory:

This piece is based on the Hymn/Carol *O How Beautiful The Sky* (Danish, anonymous). It features some meandering flute melodies and a very low pedal point which reminds me of the mystery of the stars arising. The ending chord leaves us in a suspended state, much like I imagine the Shepherds and Wisemen must have felt.

Verses to ponder while listening:

1. O how beautiful the sky, with the sparkling stars on high, How they glitter, brightly gleaming, how they twinkle, gladsome, beaming, as they draw our hearts to heaven.
2. In the midst of Christmas night, while the stars were shining bright, Of a sudden clear and radiant, One appeared and shone resplendent with the lustre of the sun.
3. Long ago it was foretold by God's chosen men of old. When at midnight such a wonder did appear in heaven up yonder, born should be a Savior King.
4. Wisemen by the star were led to the Christ-child's lowly bed. Guiding star, O may we heed thee, may we know we ever need thee. Lead us to our heavenly King.
5. In His word did God provide, such a star to be our guide. Holy writ, the Gospel story, doth reveal to us the glory. Leading onward, on to Christ.
