

The Liturgy at Calvary



Jesus begins his public ministry by calling fishers to leave their nets and follow him. In Jesus the kingdom of God has come near. We who have walked in darkness have seen a great light. We see this light most profoundly in the cross—as God suffers with us and all who are oppressed by sickness, sin, or evil. Light dawns for us as we gather around the word, the font, and the holy table. We are then sent to share the good news that others may be “caught” in the net of

God's grace and mercy.

Today the church also commemorates the Conversion of Paul. The week of prayer begun by the remembrance of Peter's confession now comes to an end as we recall the pivotal moment in the life of the other pillar of the early church, the apostle Paul. His encounter with the risen Christ turned him from persecutor of the followers of Christ to one of their leaders.

10 Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. 11 For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. 12 What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." 13 Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? 14 I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, 15 so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. 16 (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) 17 For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. 18 For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.


A Let us profess the faith in which we are Baptized.



Upcoming Commemorations

Timothy, Titus, and Silas, missionaries

Monday, January 26, 2026

These three early Christian men were missionary companions of the apostle Paul. Timothy became bishop of Ephesus, Titus bishop of Crete, and Silas was imprisoned with Paul at Philippi until they were delivered by an earthquake.

Lydia, Dorcas, and Phoebe, witnesses to the faith

Tuesday, January 27, 2026

Women as well as men were important Christian leaders from the beginning, as demonstrated by these coworkers of the apostle Paul. Lydia, a seller of purple goods, lent her home for a church; Dorcas was known for charitable works; and Phoebe was a deacon in the church at Cenchrae.

Thomas Aquinas, teacher, died 1274

Wednesday, January 28, 2026

One of the most brilliant and creative theologians in the church's history, Aquinas worked to bring together scripture and the philosophy of Aristotle. A member of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), Aquinas was also a hymn writer.

Notes by Debbie on today's organ Offertory

Offertory:

This piece is based on the Hymn/Carol *O How Beautiful The Sky* (Danish, anonymous). It features some meandering flute melodies and a very low pedal point which reminds me of the mystery of the stars arising. The ending chord leaves us in a suspended state, much like I imagine the Shepherds and Wisemen must have felt.

Verses to ponder while listening:

1. O how beautiful the sky, with the sparkling stars on high, How they glitter, brightly gleaming, how they twinkle, gladsome, beaming, as they draw our hearts to heaven.
2. In the midst of Christmas night, while the stars were shining bright, Of a sudden clear and radiant, One appeared and shone resplendent with the lustre of the sun.
3. Long ago it was foretold by God's chosen men of old. When at midnight such a wonder did appear in heaven up yonder, born should be a Savior King.
4. Wisemen by the star were led to the Christ-child's lowly bed. Guiding star, O may we heed thee, may we know we ever need thee. Lead us to our heavenly King.
5. In His word did God provide, such a star to be our guide. Holy writ, the Gospel story, doth reveal to us the glory. Leading onward, on to Christ.
