

In addition, clients may have their energy bill paid once a year through a grant offered by TXU.

Calvary Lutheran has about a dozen volunteers actively involved with NEED. These volunteers stock and sort food and prepare the food carts that are given to the clients. Their dedication is greatly appreciated.

- Painting a cafeteria at their preschool, Goldman School
- Creating a Speech Therapy Room at Goldman School
- Building a storage closet (from the ground up) at Goldman School
- Transforming a closet into a teacher break space
- Organizing supplies and materials
- Painting/beautifying restrooms at Frost/Conley Center for adult clients
- Creating a computer lab at Frost/Conley Center for adult clients
- Creating a library at Frost/Conley Center for adult clients
- We were treated to a tour & thank you lunch at the Equestrian Center on our way out of town

Thank you to our adults (\*) for all of the things! Your compassion, patience, sense of humor and willingness to jump in, all while sharing your knowledge with teenagers, made the week fun and successful! Thank you!

#### Excerpts from the Sermons about the Mission Trip

Our gifts are all different and we are called to use whatever we have. I think we are also called to embrace other people's gifts. We had a lot of different projects this week and we completed them with whatever talents we brought to this trip and other projects were completed because someone else had a gift and taught it to us. -Anna

The aspect of this (laundry) operation that I appreciated the most was that every bundle of folded linen that was packaged, was signed by whoever put it together on the packaging. Saying, this is a piece of me, I did this. Like how God signs his name on us at baptism so that we can be Christlike, and disciples. -Jack

#### Let us continue to find and create peaceful places for us to have our holy time. -Marley

The other part of our theme verse that stood out to me was that we should serve others as faithful stewards of God's grace. Grace is all of the things God gives us. God brought us to Shreveport with the skills we have within us. When the principal of the school saw the completed projects, she was overcome with emotions. We celebrated the gift of God's grace by sharing our gifts with others. -Anna

After a few days of pouring ourselves into the space we were given, and making every detail satisfactory as if it was our own. We signed our name on our finished product. We put our signature on it so they can continue to put their signature on what they enjoy, and continue to grow with caring, love and opportunity. – Jack

The Calvary youth group has been my place, and the lounge will be the teacher's place. A place to relax, a place to escape, a place to call their own. It is so special to me that I was granted the opportunity to create that for others, as it has been created for me. -Marley

We were worshiping by the pool when an older couple joined us in singing and even in communion. It was such a great moment to share God's love. When we receive God's grace and then share it with others it becomes a big circle where everyone feels valued. -Anna

Reflecting on the week, as well as my other experiences with Calvary, I wouldn't want to have it any other way. Like how the clients at Frost find comfort and belonging in that community, my community is at Calvary. I'm so grateful to be a part of this congregation and to be surrounded by such great people in the youth group. -Jack

After our nightly devotion in the sanctuary, we were sent to bed. We were all tired and lacked energy, but as we walked back to our air mattresses, we hooked a right into the kitchen and began to sing a bunch of songs extremely loud and entirely off key, but the lack of tune didn't matter because the passion was there. It was in that moment that it hit me that I was going to miss this, the way one friend starts to sing and suddenly guitars come out and dancing fills the room because it's just what we need. When Janelle walked over, she smiled and began to sing the final verse of Holy Time with us. She knew that this was our holy time, that we needed that moment of peace within each other to feel fulfilled to go to bed. When the last lyric was sung and the guitar faded out, Janelle kissed each of us on the forehead and sent us to bed. I felt a strong sense of peace that night when I laid my head down, knowing that I had a place I belonged and friends that would sing together at 11 o'clock because it just makes sense to us, and a youth director that would allow it to continue, even if you have a long work day the next day. -Marley

# The Church Mouse

Wow! July has been a busy month. Momma says Calvary talks about God's Heart and Human Hands. I was not sure how that could work, but Momma says that God's love lives in our hearts and it makes our hands move to help other people. Our mouse paws help people and critters too!

There was lots of God's Heart through Human Hands this month, starting on July 1 when the Room in the Inn volunteers spent the day getting ready for our friends that don't have a place to live. They made beds, set out towels, stocked the bathrooms with toiletries, prepared dinner and set the tables, made snacks and stocked the fridge with drinks and ice cream. In case you do not know what this all means, let me tell you! We have a team that opens Calvary's doors to ten homeless men on Tuesday nights in July & August (the hottest months) and January & February (the coldest months). They pick our guests up from the Tru Worth Center in Ft. Worth and they get to hang out at Calvary and have snacks, take showers, get some new clothes, eat dinner, hang out and then have a safe place to sleep where they know that their belongings and themselves will be safe. The innkeepers and Daddy stay overnight with our guests to make sure they have everything they need. In the morning they get breakfast and a bus pass before they load up and we take them back to the Tru Worth Center.

The Calvary big kids went on a Mission Trip this summer — it is nothing like the movie Mission Impossible, but it still sounds cool! So, a mission trip is where you celebrated God's Heart, Human Hands as you help neighbors. Mommas went this year to check it out since I will be old enough to go soon! The teenagers led worship, built things, painted, and made thing beautiful and functional, which Momma said was good. They apparently track through paint like me and had to spend time cleaning the floors. Whew, it is good to know I am not the only one!

Momma said what was special to watch was how the kids treated the people in Shreveport and each other. She teared up telling Daddy how they joked around, but they all helped each other, taught each other things they knew and how kind they were to the people they met, especially the ones that were different than them. (Do not be alarmed by the tears part. I have learned that my momma sheds more tears when she is happy than sad) She said that all of the mommas of these kids would be so proud! All I have to say is Thank You big kids, because momma will DEFINITELY let me go on mission trip when I am a big kid!

Lot's of people at church are God's Heart as they fix things at church or for a neighbor, give rides to people, prepare & deliver meals and visit with people. Momma says God's heart beats through the ordinary things that we all do. There is a constant, familiar rhythm to the heartbeat of loving your neighbor.
