## SAFETY AT CALVARY

At Calvary, we want everyone who comes through our doors to feel welcome, cared for, and safe. To support that, we have plans in place for emergencies such as fire, tornado, medical situations, or other crises. By being prepared together, we can help ensure the well-being of all who gather here.

## **AWARENESS / PREVENTION**

Calvary has a variety of things in place to keep our people and property safe.

- Locked doors if you arrive late for worship, please enter through the east doors
- Ushers & Greeters
- Special locks on the Sunday School doors
- Collaboration with local emergency services
- First Aid/AED stations
- · Background checks for those who work with children/youth
- 3 Fire Extinguishers

### **FIRE**

In case of a fire alarm, proceed to the end of Baker Blvd where it dead ends. If you see a fire please pull the fire alarm to alert others. The fire department will let us know when it is safe to reenter the building. There are fire extinguishers in the building: next to sacristy, kitchen & in the Education wing.

#### TORNADO

In the event of a tornado warning, proceed to an interior room: Ladies restroom near sanctuary, church office, workroom, closets across from the Fellowship Hall. classroom 2 (by the mailboxes), Library, Family restroom, nursery or FLC restrooms.

### **MEDICAL**

Calvary has 2 First Aid/AED stations in the building: One is outside the sanctuary (across from the office, near the 2 couches). The second one is in the Education wing, to the right of the FLC doors. Each station has an AED machine, bandages, glucosamine, baby aspirin, first aid book, Calvary's address if you need to call 911 and more.

## THREAT OF **VIOLENCE**

In the event of a threat of violence lock yourself in the room you are in. If you are in an open space hide or run. Call 911 if you are able

If you have a child in the building during an emergency

If you have a child at Calvary during a scheduled event for children or youth (Sunday School, Wednesday Night activities, retreats or special events) they will follow safety routines with their counselors / teachers / adult leaders. They will be reunited with you after the emergency is over. All classrooms have a safety plan that everyone working with children reviews on a regular basis.

These classes will be formatted in a way that you can attend even if you miss a week or two!
